

## **The Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test**

## Wednesday, March 27, 2019 ~ What to Expect!

There are four test booklets – two Question Booklets and two corresponding Answer Booklets. You will have 75 minutes to complete each of the Question Booklets. They are broken up as follows:

## Reading Reading information paragraph selections: (225 to 250 words) · news report (225 to 250 words) dialogue (225 to 250 words) · real-life narrative (550 to 600 words) graphic text (fewer than 150 words) Types of multiple-choice questions: open-response (six lines each)

Types of writing tasks and questions:	<ul> <li>long-writing tasks</li> <li>news report (one page)</li> <li>series of paragraphs         expressing an opinion         (two pages)</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>two short-writing tasks (six lines each)</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>multiple-choice questions</li> <li>developing a main idea with supporting details</li> <li>organization of ideas</li> <li>language conventions</li> </ul>



- Use the rough note sections to jot down a few ideas BEFORE you start writing your answer
- ALWAYS, ALWAYS write on all of the lines provided do not leave any blank space or skip lines. Writing on all of the lines is very important to demonstrate that you can fulfill the length requirements and expectations
- Put part of the question in your answer
  - o Example: It is important to describe this map as a treasure because . . .
- Begin with a topic sentence that answers the question and use a closing sentence to end
- Always aim to include at least 3 convincing points/reasons/supporting details to prove your answer and use transition words to connect the reasons:
  - o One reason is . . . Another reason is . . . The last reason is . . .
- Manage your time so that you complete all sections of the test
